Also an adjunct professor with the University of Maryland's Far East Division in business management.

1989-1990 : leader of a senior task force to consolidate army command and control throughout the Asia-Pacific region  
1990-1991 : special adviser to the commanding general of the US Army, Pacific  
1993 : a liaison officer for the U.S. Army, Pacific, in the Pentagon  
1994 : US Office of Personnel Management legis congressional fellow with the Senate Appropriations Committee.  
1997 – 2003 : majority and minority staff director of the Military Construction Subcom, US Senate Committee on appropriations : « *During that time, she successfully orchestrated and implemented the congressional strategy to override the first presidential line item veto of military projects on any appropriations bill. During her tenure with the Defense Subcommittee, she was responsible for formulating annual funding and legislation recommendations for defense and intelligence spending in excess of \$600 billion annually.* »
