Greg Lankler is a Managing Director of Mercury in Washington, DC.

Before joining Mercury, Mr. Lankler served as a Professional Staff Member on the House Appropriations Committee's Subcommittee on Defense. Since March 2001, he has held multiple portfolios on the subcommittee specializing in Department of Defense and Intelligence Community research, development and acquisition programs. Most recently, he was part of the subcommittee's Select Intelligence Oversight Panel staff covering Central Intelligence Agency and Special Operations Command programs and activities.

From 2003 until 2007 Mr. Lankler was responsible

for the Air Force's research, development, and procurement programs. Additionally, for the first two years of his tenure, he was responsible for Department of Defense and Military Service information technology programs, as well as the research, development and procurement programs for the Defense-Wide Agencies and the Office of the Secretary of Defense.

Prior to joining the committee, Mr. Lankler worked for 11 years in the office of Congressman C.W. Bill Young serving as a Legislative Assistant from 1990 through 1996, and Legislative Director from 1996 until 2001.

Mr. Lankler, who holds a B.A. in Political Science from the University of Delaware, lives in Rockville, Maryland with his wife, Tracey, and their three children.

Grand jury subpoena issued to Appropriations staffer in Lewis probe

A federal grand jury in Los Angeles has issued a subpoena for a House Appropriations Committee staffer as part of the ongoing probe of Rep. Jerry Lewis (R-Calif.), the ranking member of the powerful panel.

Greg Lankler, a staffer on the House Appropriations Committee's Defense subcommittee, was recently subpoenaed by a federal grand jury looking into Lewis, according to House insiders.

The subpoena is for both documents and testimony, although it is unclear at this point whether Lankler will cooperate. The matter has been forwarded to the House general counsel's office, which is still studying the subpoena.

A number of grand jury subpoenas were issued in the summer of 2006 as the Justice Dept. looked into Lewis' relationship with Bill Lowery, a former California Republican who had left Capitol Hill to become a lobbyist. Lewis steered millions of dollars in earmarks to Lowery's clients, who in turn donated tens of thousands of dollars to Lewis' re-election efforts.

In addition, several Lewis' aides worked for Lowery, before and after joining Lewis' staff.

Lewis has denied any wrongdoing, although he has shelled out more than \$900,000 in fees to defense attorneys representing him in the probe.

The investigation had been outwardly dormant for an extended period of time, and sources close to Lewis have suggested that it was over, but the Lankler subpoena shows that Justice is still looking into the veteran lawmaker's activities.

Lankler, a professional staffer hired by the Appropriations panel under former Chairman Bill Young (R-Fla.), could not be reached for comment at press time.

Justice Dept. officials would not comment on the subpoena other than to confirm the Lewis' probe remains active.

Lewis is the most high-profile of several House Republicans under investigation by the Justice Dept. and FBI. Rep. Rick Renzi (R-Ariz.) has seen his business office raided by FBI agents, while Rep. John Doolittle (R-Calif.) has had his home searched as part of a continuing investigation into his ties with imprisoned GOP lobbyist Jack Abramoff.

Rep. William Jefferson (D-La.) has been indicted on a series of federal corruption charges, including bribery, and he is scheduled to go on trial early next year.

On the Senate side, Sen. Ted Stevens (R-Alaska) is under investigation for his ties to oil services firm VECO, as is his son, Ben Stevens.
